The JSTS Summer Tour! (a history and an invitation)

The JSTS Summer Tour started in the early 2000's with a group of club members attending the annual Bike Virginia event. BikeVa continued as an annual JSTS destination through their 2012 event.

Our BikeVirgina tour history:

2005-Valley Byways Tour-Roanoke, Lexington

2006-Tour de Love-Emporia, Lawrenceville, Roanoke Rapids

2007-Captain John Smith Adventure-Hopewell, Williamsburg

2008-Crooked Road Tour-Bristol, Culpepper, Orange

2009-Journey thru the Hallowed Grounds-Charlottesville, Culpepper, Orange

2010-Knights of the Golden Wheel-Staunton, Harrisonburg

2011-New River-Roll through Time-Pulaski, Radford, Blacksburg

2012-25 years- Winchester, Berryville, Harpers Ferry

In late 2012, when the details of the 2013 Bike Virginia became available, several club members tossed around the idea of creating an alternative, 'more accessible' tour - easier to get to, and, overall, less expensive.

We envisioned a 4-day tour of the Finger Lakes, centered in Ithaca, NY. We partnered with the Finger Lakes Cycling Club to create some scenic routes with historic stops in and around Watkins Glen, Geneva, Seneca Falls, Taughannock Falls, Cayuga Lake, Seneca Lake and more. Twenty-two riders attended.... And so the JSTS Summer Tour, in its current format, was born!

Our tour history:

2013-Finger Lakes with 22 riders

2014-Western Mass with 14 riders

2015-Vermont with 20 riders

2016-Finger Lakes with 16 riders

2017-Lancaster with 30 riders

2018 Finger Lakes with 22 riders

2019-Bike Virginia and SkyLine Drive-30 riders

2021 and 2022-POSTPONED

Which brings us to 2023.....

Join us for the 2023 JSTS Summer Tour in the Hudson Valley. Our home base for this 4-day, self supported ride will be the Best Western Plus Kingston Hotel and Conference Center.

We are planning routes from 30 to 100 miles for up to 4 days of riding, and you are welcome to join for all or just some of the days. While in past years the majority of the people attending the summer tour have been B/B+/A-riders, our preliminary survey to gauge interest in the tour this year showed that we have riders interested in joining the tour at ALL pace levels!

Part of the plan is to participate in the organized **Discover Hudson Valley 2023** ride on Sunday, June 25 - centered around the Walkway Over the Hudson, the world's longest footbridge.

As a self-supported ride, there will be no official SAG available. Riders should be prepared to perform basic repairs while on the road (like fixing a flat), as there won't be anyone riding around in a car to fix a flat for you;






